





<u>Program message:</u> It briefly explains the objectives and activities necessary to achieve them, and also identifies the program's development paths and directions.

Program Goals: They are statements that describe what the academic program

intends to achieve within a specific period of time and are measurable and

observable.

<u>Curriculum structure:</u> All courses/study subjects included in the academic

program according to the approved learning system (semester, annual, Bologna
